



Over San Juan County

Update: July 19, 2017

Greetings:

We've had relatively "light" Growler noise since April . . . ONLY 408 REPORTS from April - July 18.

WE CAN'T AFFORD TO BE COMPLACENT: The Navy is projecting, in the current Environmental Impact statement (EIS), a 47 percent increase in Growler noise when 36 more Growlers are added to the current 82 now based at Ault Field on Whidbey Island.

COMMENT PERIOD FOR THE FINAL EIS (FEIS): When the FEIS is released (probably this fall), we will all have an opportunity to comment on the Navy's changes or - lack of changes to the Draft EIS.

- RIGHT NOW - ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT THINGS EACH OF US CAN DO is to continue to report Growler noise - being specific about the time(s) it occurs, the date, and the kind of noise. Use the comment section to say how the noise is affecting your life. Brief Comments to legislators can also be included because they receive the Noise profiles monthly.

SO PLEASE KEEP THE JET NOISE REPORTS COMING! 7,748 GROWLER noise reports have been entered since May 2014.

Peace and quiet is a treasured quality in the San Juan Islands. Our way of life, our economy and our property values are intertwined with our peaceful environment. 47 Percent more noise will move us a giant step closer to becoming a Navy War Training Zone.
